During the Portland Convention last June, President Jan Wendorf challenged us to become more literate in the Bible. This committee would like to encourage you to do just that. But first, may we ask if you are having trouble facing life today? The economy is just one item in our lives that bothers us as well as personal problems. Our world is full of stress! Yes, the Devil is alive and well. Yes, he will prey on every believer and will be much more diligent than on those he has already won.

Webster describes STRESS as: strain or straining force; force exerted upon a body, that tends to strain or deform its shape such as mental or physical tension or strain. That describes life today but help is to be found. Go to your Bible; open it in the center. You will find the book of Psalms. This book of the Bible has many comforting verses that point to our Father, Son and Holy Spirit. David was favored by God, but he also sinned. Things did not go well for David at times but he took time to repent. God listened and forgave him. David was then able to live a less stressful life.

Turning to our Bibles and permitting God to speak to us from His Word enables us to realize the comfort that God intended us to experience. We ended our time together with prayer and agreed to meet again after Thanksgiving. We were amazed at the warmth and comfort we felt in being together in God's Word. Yes, tears were shed and laughter was heard during this time. But, we all realized that God was with us and we know the Holy Spirit intercedes for us to make our simple prayers beautiful music in God's ears.

The Coming of Advent

Greetings to you in the Name of Jesus! The end of the year has crept up on us! Christmas decorations are already on display in most stores and malls weeks before Thanksgiving and the end of the church year. We can hardly escape the reminders of the biggest retail event of the year! However, Christians should remember that before Christmas comes the season of Advent. So what exactly is the season of Advent all about?

The word Advent derives from the Latin word *adventus*. It means "to come" or "to arrive." Throughout the season of Advent, we remember and celebrate a three-fold "coming" of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The first "coming" is known as the visitation of God in human flesh as a babe lying in a manger in the City of Bethlehem. Of course, we know this day as Christmas!

Another "coming" will take place when Jesus comes again in the future to "judge the living and the dead"—we call this Jesus's Second Coming or Judgment Day. The visitation of Jesus at the Last Day will unite the bodies and souls of all believers.

In the mean time, between these two "comings," Jesus comes among His followers to comfort and to serve us His good gifts in Word and Sacrament for the forgiveness of our sins and strengthening of our faith. God's visitation continues as the Word made Flesh is preached into our ears and the Body and Blood of Jesus is placed into our mouths during Holy Communion.

What a great and wondrous joy it is that our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ actively participates in His creation! These three "comings" of Jesus are all a part of the Collect of the Day for the Season of Advent. Listen to see if you can hear about them as your congregation prays these collects each Sunday.

It is okay to be excited and look forward to seeing family and friends, opening gifts, and eating good holiday food at Christmas. You've heard it said, "Jesus is the reason for the season." Yet before all that, the season of Advent helps the Christian church slow down and reflect upon the significance for our salvation of the "comings" of Jesus brings into the world.

Listen for the three-fold coming of Jesus as you sing the favorite Advent hymn, *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*.
