Wonder Bread!

Jesus says: "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to Me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in Me shall never thirst" (John 6:35). "It's the greatest thing since sliced bread!" There was a time when you couldn't buy sliced bread. But a product was introduced in 1921 that helped change the way we think about bread.

Advertising stated that a wonder was coming. The product's name was inspired by the International Balloon Race at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. One man was stirred as he saw the kaleidoscope of color that the hot air balloons made in the air. It was a wonder! An advertising icon would be born: Wonder Bread with its colorful balloons of red, blue, and yellow on the packaging. Whatever you think of soft and squishy bread that's perfectly white and smooth, Wonder Bread really was a wonder. It changed the way people thought about bread. It brought the safety standards of mass production to this particular industry. And now some use that expression: "It's the greatest thing since sliced bread!"

Actually, there is something a whole lot better than sliced white bread – even better than sliced wheat bread! It's Jesus. The Bread of Life. He is the true Wonder Bread of God. He is "the Bread of God...who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world" (John 6:33). Jesus came down to us in the incarnation. He took on flesh and blood for us and for our salvation. For our eternal benefit His holy flesh was pierced and His precious blood was poured out.

Our salvation is in Him. But if we would go the distance in the life of faith, we need to feed on Him. We need the Word and Sacraments in which He brings all the benefits of His Cross and Empty Tomb down to us today. The Lord gives His saving gifts in order that our faith would be sustained and strengthened. Yes, we need Jesus. He is the Bread we need above and beyond all other bread. When Jesus calls Himself "the Bread of Life," this is a sermon on faith. To eat this Wonder Bread is to believe in Christ and live forever. As our Lord stated it simply and plainly in that very same context: "For My Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in Him shall have eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day"

Serving the Blind and Spreading the News of the LWML

In 1996, The Lutheran Layman published an appeal from the Lutheran Library for the Blind seeking people willing to read books onto audiocassettes for the blind and those with low vision. I sent in a 10-minute sample tape. The process began. After 15 years I took a hiatus from reading books onto audiocassette. I remained open to reading magazines, but none were available. Four days later, I was offered and accepted, reading the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly onto audiocassette.

During the next year, The Lutheran Library for the Blind became part of Lutheran Braille Worker's, Inc. Once the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly is read onto audiocassette it is shipped to Lutheran Braille Worker's Inc. in Yucaipa, CA. Two master copies are produced from the original and then shipped with labels to the work center. The work center makes copies and mails them. At the present time, 86 people receive the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly in audiocassette form.

PARLIAMENTARY PAUSE



Should the President Vote?

That depends – is it a ballot or a voice vote?

If it is a ballot vote and the president is a voting member, she votes along with the assembly. If it is a tie vote then everyone votes by ballot again.

If it's a voice vote or raise of hands, then it is the president's duty to maintain the appearance of impartiality; and therefore, should refrain from voting except when her vote will affect the result. When a majority vote is needed to pass a motion, a tie will cause the motion to fail because a tie is not a majority of the vote. At that point, the president can decide if she wants the motion to pass, she can break the tie with a positive vote. If she does not want the motion to pass she can still refrain from voting and cause the motion to fail due to lack of majority vote. If there is a motion and it passes by one vote, the president can also decide to cast a vote in the negative, and therefore cause a tie and the motion will fail. This would also apply to a 2/3 vote.

Remember the president votes at the same time as the members for ballot voting. In all other cases, the president only votes if she wants her vote to affect the result.
