 - 22 boxes of towels and linens
- \$31,331 in gift cards, cash, and checks, with more still coming in

Pastor's COLUMN

August 2017

Matthew 10 ²⁶ “So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. ²⁷ What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. ²⁸ And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. ²⁹ Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. ³⁰ But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. ³¹ Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows.

In Matthew 9:35-11:1, we have what Dr. David Scaer calls Matthew's Second or Missionary Discourse. Jesus singles out His first twelve disciples and sends them forth with authority and reassurances. All of Scripture teaches that our God is a God of mission. He's been on a mission ever since time began. Scripture points to the Father sending His only beloved Son on a mission to save sinners, it points to the Son sending His first century apostles on that very same mission, it points to the Spirit of God sending out every local Christian congregation in all the world in every generation to forgive the sins of the penitent and to not forgive the sins of the impenitent.

In his book “Joining Jesus on His Mission,” author Greg Finke suggest that we 21st century disciples consider every day to be a mission trip, that we would spend time every day looking people in the eyes, spending time every day listening carefully to folks who have stories to tell, spending time asking good questions to folks who are hurting in a variety of ways, spending time doing good things for people, and then he suggests that look for opportunities to pray with and for people in all the circumstances of life.

We do well to pray as Jesus taught those first disciples – that the Lord of the harvest would send out more laborers into His harvest. Recently I read an article that suggested that a majority of unchurched people say they would come to church if they were invited by a friend and family member. The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.

Three words of reassurance we have in Matthew 10:26-31, as we proceed as laborers in a plentiful harvest.

- Reassurance #1 – Even though the darkness often seems to be prevailing, the Light will win out in the end.
- Reassurance #2 – Even though the enemies of your faith may be able to harm your body, they will never have the authority to touch your soul.
- Reassurance #3 – Even though the world in which we live seems full of chaos, God is in fact, ruling over all of, and He has declared His disciples/missionaries to be of infinite value.

The Kingdom of God is like a Christian woman who is increasingly discouraged and upset about the society in which she lives. She holds to the teachings she learned from her mother's knees, but more and more of her friends and family see those teachings as signs of intolerance, even hatred. She believes with all her heart that God loves everybody, but she also believes that what is right is right and what is wrong is wrong. On the one hand, she more and more feels like she is in the minority, but on the other hand, she is certain that God is faithful to the promises He made to her in Holy Baptism. She knows that she has been declared holy and precious in the sight of God. She has been declared holy and precious in the sight of God. She has been redeemed not with gold, silver, or credit cards, but with holy precious blood, with the innocent suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. These days she is learning what it means that her faith is personal but not meant to be private.

The kingdom of God is like a Christian woman who is on a mission. Less and less she wants to tell her own stories, more and more she has a desire to listen to her neighbor's stories. Slower and slower these days she is to give unsolicited advice, that she should stay out of other people's business, these days she is asking herself what it means to be about her Father's business.

PARLIAMENTARY PAUSE

Did you know?

Many may groan when someone calls out “point of order” but I believe all can realize the importance of orderly meetings. The basic rules have not changed and since summers are famous for reruns, I am going to re-run some Parliamentary Pause moments from Myrna Behrens back in the early 2000’s.

*A motion on a recommendation or resolution from a committee does not require a second, since they come from committees in which more than one person had already recommended their consideration.

*A committee is not required to keep minutes of its meetings. The chairman or an elected ‘recorder’ should take notes, however, to enable the committee to continue its work in the next meeting and also to help in preparation of its report.

*Silence gives consent. Those who do not vote when the vote is taken agree, by their silence, to allow the decision to be made by those who do vote.

*A motion can be withdrawn at any time before voting on the question has begun, even when it has been amended or when an amendment or other subsidiary or incidental motion is pending. When withdrawn during the same meeting in which it was introduced, it is not recorded in the minutes.

It's Equalization Time!

Every year the LWML Minnesota South District Board of Directors sets and collects an equalization fee from each member of the district. But what is it? Where does it go? Equalization is the funding to help the zone delegates to attend the national conventions every other year. This year the equalization fee will remain \$4.50 per person. This will allow us to collect enough funds for the national convention in 2019 to help pay for the registration, meals, transportation and lodging of the zone delegates. Any amount spent over the amount given is the responsibility of the delegate. If a delegate does not use the entire amount given, it is returned to the district treasury to collect interest until the next convention. Equalization is due to the zone treasurers by November 15, 2017 and due to the Financial Secretary by December 1, 2017.
