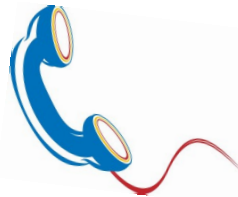
Your Story

If you think that your life and story is just ordinary, do you treasure some of the stories about your parents or grandparents? Our grandchildren might be surprised at what our childhood was like, especially as compared to their lives. As an example, I have always lived on a farm. When I was very young, we did not have a telephone. When we did get a telephone, it was the big, brown wooden box on the wall with a handle that was turned to make a call. Our "ring" was one long and four shorts. We had over twenty people on our telephone line, and you knew that there were some people that always listened or "rubbered." Compare that with my grandchildren, they all have their own "ringtone," or they text on their own cell phone which they carry with them.

One focus of "The Time is NOW" is that we tell our LWML story. I found in my Bible a worksheet that was titled, "My LWML Story." It was from a past LWML workshop. The instructions were to give a one or two sentence answer to each topic or question. I did answer the questions, and have kept it in my Bible. I review and answer them again as my life changes.

- EVENTS that have encouraged me:
- SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES that have motivated me:
- How do the above connect me with my **SAVIOR** and **HIS** story?



The answers to those questions tell your LWML story, and also tell about your Christian faith. You are saved by Jesus who came to earth, took on all your sins, suffered, died, and rose from the dead, so everyone can have eternal life. As baptized children of God, we know that we have eternal life. Our struggles remind us that we are sinners who depend on Christ's gracious forgiveness each day. Our triumphs show us His strength in our lives and the blessings He continues to shower upon us.

How Do I Know My Money Went Where I Wanted It to Go?

Whenever we take over a job, there are always things about the job that you didn't know before you got it. For me, as the new financial secretary and the one that collects all of the funds for the LWML Minnesota South District, it is making sure that the funds collected get into the correct categories for both where the people want the money to go and where the form says it is supposed to go. Sometimes, these two items are NOT the same thing.

At the February District Board of Directors meeting, each zone president was given a packet for each congregation that includes the correct Society Report of Contributions forms to be used. Both sides of this form are very important. The front side is where you tell me who you are and where you want your money to go. Please fill this out completely! The back side gives the explanation of what each line means.

There are several categories in both Outreach and In-reach in the LWML. If you want your money to go to Mites (Outreach), then you need to fill out the top part of the form. This is the funding that had 75% of it stay in the

Minnesota South District and 25% of it going on to National LWML. If you want your money to stay in the Minnesota South District totally, then you need to fill out the In-reach or bottom part of the form.

So, if you have money for mites, memorials for mission grants, donations to mission grants, offerings collected at Prayer Services or convention offerings (that you are sending because you're not attending or forgot to take it along), then they are all considered Outreach. These funds will have 75% of it stay in the Minnesota South District for our mission grants projects. The other 25% goes on to National for their projects.

If you have offerings collected for LWML on LWML Sunday, offerings taken at retreats, district memorials or any other special gifts that you've taken, they are considered In-reach and 100% stays in the Minnesota South District.

If you have any questions about filling out the form, please call me and ask. Since I do work full time, I may not answer your call during the day but will get back to you as soon as possible so make sure to leave me a message.

Understanding Individual Membership

Are you, as a society or zone, completely in sync with the LWML on Individual Membership?

The LWML has indicated that Districts must comply with the LWML by-law, but what does this mean for your society or zone? LWML says that Individual Membership is available to a woman in an LCMS congregation with or without a society affiliated with the LWML. Individual membership is designed for women who have an interest in the mission and ministry of the LWML organization, but cannot, for a variety of reasons, attend society meetings.

At the February BOD meeting, Irene Mensing, Bylaws Chairman, gave a presentation on how this affects the zones and societies. Are your bylaws clearly stating how Individual Membership will be addressed? Individual membership by itself does not confer voting rights, but if your bylaws state that you can elect or appoint an Individual Member, she then has any voting rights, if applicable, with the position.



PARLIAMENTARY PAUSE

Official Minutes

Minutes drafted ahead of time are not the official minutes until the members approve them; reason being that changes may still be made during the approval process at a meeting. Consider noting on the distribution copy that it is a “draft for approval”.

When the minutes are approved, the secretary notes corrections/additions in the margins or she can retype the minutes to include the corrections. The secretary then marks ‘Approved’ on the minutes and adds her initials and the date of approval.
