They gladly thanked God daily for clothing, food, home, family, health, and most importantly the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. It was a few Sundays ago that I walked out into the sanctuary at our congregation here at St. John's in Chaska to give the opening announcements and I waited for the ringing of the bells to call us to the beginning of the service. I was informed that the bells had already been rung – and that somehow, I had missed hearing them! One of our rituals and traditions at St. John's is to begin each service with the ringing of the bells. Without them, something seems rather out of sync. It made me wonder why this is important – so I did a little digging on the subject.

Bells are mentioned only seven times in Scriptures and only in one context.¹ However, it is obvious from the context that they are very special to God. Although bells were not used then as they are today – in church towers and by choirs in pitched sets – they were a part of every temple worship ceremony and sacrifice. In fact, bells were the only musical instrument that were taken into the Holy of Holies. When God proscribed for Moses the construction of the tabernacle, the Holy Spirit went even so far as to detail how the high priestly garments were to be made. In those instructions we read the following:

On its hem you shall make pomegranates of blue and purple and scarlet yarns, around its hem, with bells of gold between them, a golden bell and a pomegranate, a golden bell and a pomegranate, around the hem of the robe. And it shall be on Aaron when he ministers, and its sound shall be heard when he goes into the Holy Place before the Lord, and when he comes out, so that he does not die. Exodus 28:33-35

In other words, there were bells sewn all around the bottom of the high priestly garments. Every time the High Priest took a step, there would be the jingling of those bells. Note from the end of the quotation above that the main of the purpose of these bells was so that the High Priest would not die when he entered the Holy of Holies.

The Apostle Paul reminds us that because of what Jesus did for us, we are able to enter the holy places.

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Hebrews 10:19-22

So, when we begin our worship services with the ringing of bells, we recall the bells on the bottom of high priestly garments and announce to all those present and to God Himself that we have entered a Holy Place. In this Holy Place, God offers His mercy and grace just as he did when the High Priests entered the Holy of Holies in the tabernacle and the temple.

So, whenever we ring the bells for the Divine Service, we are reminded that because of Christ we do not die in the presence of our God, but rather live in and through Him. Considering how special bells are to the Lord, perhaps we should sew some on the bottom of our robes as well just like they did in the Old Testament. Now wouldn't that be something!

Bylaws vs. Standing Rules

The bylaws are the fundamental rules that define a zone or society. Bylaws are the formal structure of your group and explain how decisions can be made and how business is conducted including membership; voting rights and privileges; officers and committees; elections and finances. Bylaws are the rules that are of such importance that they cannot be easily changed.

The standing rules are administrative and establish such things as the time and location of meetings. Standing rules may be easily changed by a majority vote or be suspended for a meeting. Standing rules cannot conflict with the bylaws. Use standing rules to explain host duties at rallies or how a committee functions. Use the standing rules to keep continuity in the organization so that members know what is expected when planning a specific event. If your society does things because that is the way things have always been done, consider writing these customs down to help new members fit in.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MINNESOTA SOUTH DISTRICT LWML MISSION GRANTS PROPOSALS

A grant proposal may be submitted by LWML individual members, Units, Zones, or Conferences or LCMS-affiliated Organizations.

HOW TO REQUEST FUNDS

- A) Fill out the application form received from the LWML MN South District Gospel Outreach Chairman include the following information:
 - 1) Dates and amounts of funds needed to initiate (or continue) the grant.
 - 2) Purpose(s) for which the funds will be used. Please be specific.
 - 3) Name of person or organization to whom the check is to be made.
 - 4) Name and address of person to whom the check is to be sent.
- B) Write a proposal. The proposal should have two elements—a resolution and an informational sheet.
 - 1) The resolution should be concise and specific. It should include the grant goals, need for funds, and the amount of funds needed. It should be worded in the format of “WHEREAS,....” And “WHEREAS....” “Be it RESOLVED...”.
 - 2) The informational sheet should be detailed, giving background information of the needs, including photos relating to the grant proposal.
- C) Send in the grant proposal (application form, resolution, and informational sheet) by mail or e-mail.
